Richland Academy of the Arts (AAR) is pleased to provide this 2021 Annual Report to the parents of students enrolled in its sponsored schools and to the Ohio Department of Education (ODE) by November 30, 2021 in accordance with the Ohio Revised Code 3314.03(D)(3), ORC 3314-03(A)(11)(g) and Ohio Administrative Code 3301-102-05.

School performance as measured by state report card metrics typically serve as the foundation for RAA's summary of its sponsored schools' performance. That is not the case for RAA's 2021 Annual Report given the fact that the Legislature eliminated overall school ratings and report card metric ratings for the 2020-2021 school year.

RAA is responsible for assigning each sponsored school a rating of "exceeds," "meets," "did not meet," "falls far below" or "not rated" for performance indicators in: (1) academics; (2) organizational/operations; and (3) fiscal; and "meets" or "did not meet" in (4) legal compliance. An explanation of how ratings were determined is provided in this report.



Richland Academy of the Arts opened two new schools during the 2020-2021 school year, joining three existing schools which maintained their enrollment throughout the pandemic.

Columbus Bilingual Academy, Lorain Bilingual Academy, Case Preparatory and Northside Preparatory offered in-person, virtual and hybrid options; parents could chose which option worked best for their family. Cesar Chavez offered in-person and virtual options.

RAA continued to monitor school performance during the pandemic. We conducted remote and onsite visits, and observed recorded and synchronous online lessons and teacher "office hours" offered as extra assistance to students.

Academic performance

Most state assessments were canceled school year 2019-2020 due to the pandemic. RAA's schools administered 2020-2021 state assessments as required. 2020-2021 school year performance data is reported publicly for the purposes of recovery and improvement planning. Several report card indicators were not calculated due to missing data from school year 2019-2020.

RAA requires schools to administer nationally normed assessments (such as NWEA/MAPS and/or iReady), typically given in fall and spring, to measure student learning growth. RAA staff review and discuss this data with school staff, and it is used for progress monitoring and intervention planning.

To provide fair and appropriate context for evaluation, RAA's academic performance framework methodology compares sponsored schools to nearby traditional district schools serving similar populations and determines which quintile the sponsored school ranks in for each indicator. Schools in the highest two quintiles receive "exceeds," schools in the middle quintile receive "meets," schools in the fourth quintile receive "does not meet," and schools in the bottom quintile receive 'falls far below"as a rating for that indicator. Ratings are then averaged for an overall academic rating.
